

## Bus Routes

Baldwin-Woodville Area School District Transportation utilizes a computerized routing system in order to create safe and efficient bus routes to serve our student population. All student data is maintained in a database and each year prior to the start of school bus routes are created based on where students live. In our growing district, it is often necessary to change bus routes during the school year. Should a change become necessary to a particular route, the students will be notified during the week before the change and a letter may be sent home with all affected students prior to the effective date of the route change.

To find the proper route, bus stop, and schedule information, please contact your child's school. Approximately 2 weeks prior to the start of school, each building will have composite listing for their building which will show the route, bus stop, and pick up/drop off time for each student.

Currently, Baldwin-Woodville Transportation has implemented online service using **Family Access** that will allow students and parents to find bus stop and schedule information. Call your building office for your access codes if you do not have them.

## Bus Stops

Bus stops are generated by our computer routing software based on where students live. When practicable, bus stops are located near parks, greenbelts, and community areas so that students waiting for the bus are not standing in yards or on the street.

State law also dictates where school bus stops may be located. Click for the bus stops in the villages: **BUS STOPS.**

Bus loading zones on school property are also governed by state law. During the time of loading and unloading, only school buses, passengers, and school employees may be present in the bus loading zone. This means that the marked bus loading zones at each school are for buses only. Parents, staff, and visitors may not park in these areas at any time.
